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
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BOOKS

THE OTHER CAMPAIGN

IN 2001 DURING AN ELECTION IN MEXICO GROUP OF INDIGENOUS PEOPLE CALLED THEMSELVES **EZLN** ORGANIZED A PEACEFUL MARCH THROUGHOUT THE WHOLE COUNTRY TO MEXICO CITY.

At that time they had been in armed conflict with the Government for many years. Support the people in Mexican and around the world was huge. Many celebrities and press joined the March. The reports, tv interviews, films were produced and distributed on mass scale.

If Zapatista would want to win the election, it would be easy for them. Instead they name their spokesman – Candidate Zero and demanded to change the constitution and provide to the indigenous people with the right of autonomy as well as to ban privatization of public land and natural resources.

Working for 20 years community of ZAPATISTA BUILT A LOTS OF SCHOOLS AND HOSPITALS, THEY PRESERVED THEIR LANGUAGES and cultures and they build a strong international support not only for themselves, but for the other oppressed group of people around the globe.



Many attribute this to the fact how the Zapatista turned for help to the international community:

THEY STUCK OUT THEIR LEADERS, AND TALKED ABOUT THE PROBLEMS OF THE COMMUNITY. LINKED THE PROBLEMS OF THE COMMUNITY AND THE STRUGGLE FOR THE RIGHTS OF OTHER OPPRESSED AND NEGLECTED COMMUNITIES AROUND THE WORLD.



They do not get tired and gave interviews, wrote books, made films, invited to his journalists and artists, organized festivals and meetings.

You became the head of the revolt of the oppressed in the country, which is ruled by a brutal dictator. You have an opportunity to organize.




What is privacy?


